The Kingston Village Office is now located at 655 Main St and is open from 8am to 4pm. Please drop in or contact the office by phone or email if you have any questions or concerns.

Property Tax Bills - No increase in the Village's residential or commercial tax rate for the 8th consecutive year. Our property tax bills are issued in May (Interim) and September (Final). The combined amount covers the fiscal year from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021. Property taxes may be paid the following ways: Online Banking, Telephone Banking, At Your Local Bank, in person at the office with Cash, Cheque or Debit. The Village Office does not accept credit cards. The Village also offers monthly payment plans through our automatic debit program. A Pre-Authorized Debit form (on website or at the office) is required, as well as a void cheque or banking information. Previously the County of Kings collected taxes on behalf of the Village and charged a commission. With new technology we now collect our own. Village Commissioner Openings - The Village has 5 Commissioners to represent the residents. They are elected at-large for three year terms, this year there are 2 openings. HELP SHAPE YOUR COMMUNITY! To become a Village Commissioner you have to be at least 18 years of age and have been residing in Kingston for a period of at least 6 months immediately preceding Election Day. Nomination forms will be available Thursday, Oct. 8 and must be returned by Wed. Oct. 21st Commissioner Election (if necessary)

Wastewater Management

The Village of Kingston maintains it's own Sewer Treatment Plant. This infrastructure is very costly to upgrade and maintain. Residents are reminded to flush TOILET PAPER ONLY. NO WIPES - includes all flushable-style wipes. Wipes and rags cause blockages which can create backups and are very inconvenient and costly to repair.

Water Testing

Kingston Village Office is now a drop off location for Envirosphere water testing. Water tests can also be taken to Soldier's Memorial Hospital in Middleton
