## Village Property Tax Bills

Village property tax bills are issued in May (Interim) and September (Final). The combined amount covers the fiscal year of April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2024. **Payment Options:** 

**Pre-Authorized Monthly or Full Amount Debit Payment Plans** are available. Please submit a completed pre-authorized debit form (available on our website or at the office), and a void cheque or banking information.

Office Payments - Cash, cheque or debit only (no credit card payments). Online banking, telephone banking or at your bank. Online Banking Tip – to add payee, search 'KINGSTON' then select 'KINGSTON, VILLAGE OF, NS TAXES' (it may vary). Use your assessment account number (AAN) as the account number. Mortgage paying your taxes? Confirm with the village office that you are set up with your mortgage company. You will still receive your tax bill, please read it carefully.

# Mailing Address Updates:

Property owners must ensure their mailing address is up-to-date to receive their tax bill. Contact PVSC (Property Valuation Services Corp) at 1-800-380-7775 or pvsc.ca J-Class Road Paving 2023

Prince St. and Mosher St. were approved by the County of Kings and the NS Dept. of Public Works for resurfacing this year as part of the J-Class road paving. (Bishop Ave and Polaris Court were earlier prioritized but not approved).

### Winter Sidewalk Maintenance

During winter months, help Village Public Works' efforts in keeping the sidewalks free of snow by removing green carts from sidewalk immediately after garbage pickup. Sewer Issues? Calling us first could save you money!

The first call should be to the Village Office - 8am to 4pm or after hours to Village staff at 902-844-0454 or 902-844-1257 who will inspect to see if the problem is in the Village's main line. *Make sure you have a backwater valve to prevent sewer backups.* 

Leaf/Brush Bins for Village Residents – Credit Union Centre Arena Bins will be located next to arena (north entrance) on Westwood St. late Oct/Nov

and are available to residents of Kingston. Plastic **bags of leaves must be emptied** in bin and bags disposed of in the available can. Paper bags are acceptable.

## Valley Waste Resource Management (VWRM)

- FALL CLEANUP for Week 1 areas (Kingston) Oct 16<sup>th</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> <u>Opposite Your Regular Garbage Week.</u> Items should be placed curbside on Sunday, October 15<sup>th</sup> and will be picked up once that week. <u>https://www.vwrm.com/services/spring-and-fall-clean-ups/</u>

- NO LEAF PICK UP by VWRM, but you can bring bagged leaves to their Management Centers for free OR mulch and leave them for a healthy lawn.
- New Valley Waste calendars will be available late December and available at the Kingston Village Office.
- Christmas Trees can be cut into 4ft lengths, bundled and set out as brush for regular collection.
